In celebration of their appearance and to keep them with some lucky winner year-round, we've chosen a block from the May/June 2000 issue of Fons and Porter's For the Love of Quilting.

Fabric Choices — Gather your pastel collection to make this 1930s-style block.

METHOD: Appliqué a posy using method of your choice—needle-turn, fusible, machine, etc. If you are going to needle-turn, add 3/16" to the templates below. If using fusible web, use template exactly as it is.

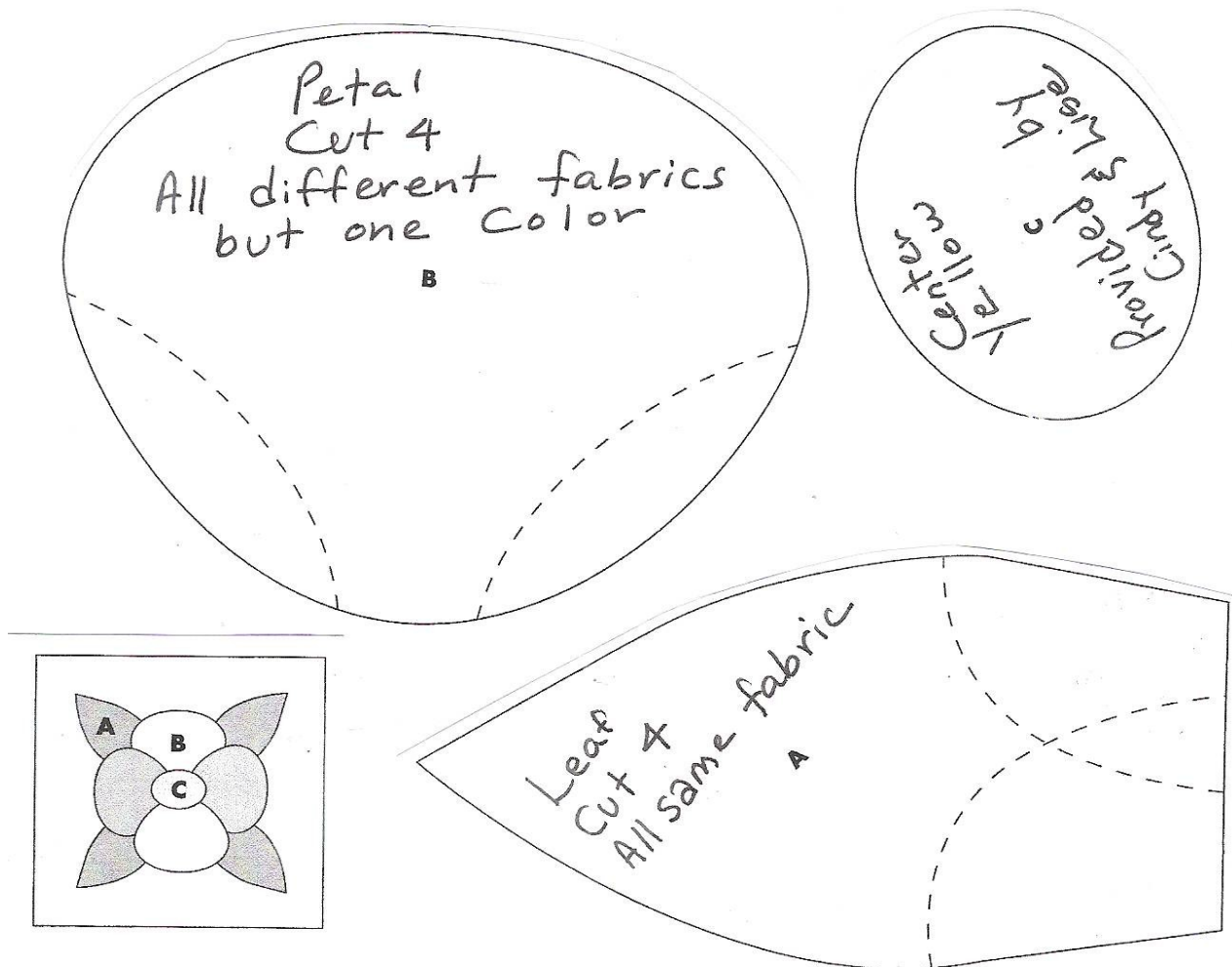
Fabric Requirement:

12-1/2" square of White-on-White (background) - Your block will be 12-1/2" to finish to a 12" block.

Pastel Green for Leaves (all four leaves the Same Fabric)

Four Different Fabrics Pastels of the Same Color for the Petals (4 pink prints, 4 blue prints, etc.)

Yellow for the Center of the Posy. (Choose from your stash if you didn't pick one up at March meeting)
