Fabric Requirement:  
 White-on-Black Print  
 Black-on-White Print  
 Red Print

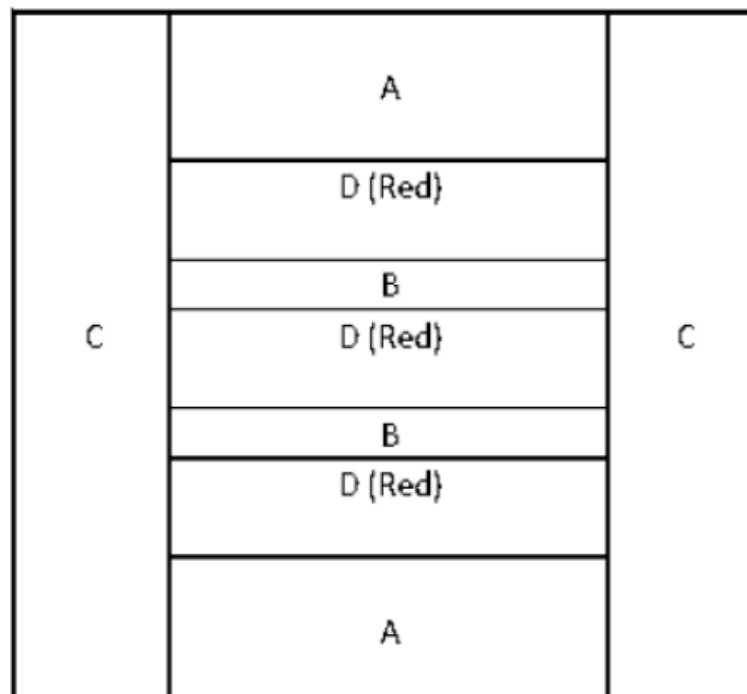
**SIZE:** Block will be 6-1/2" unfinished (6" in quilt.)  
 They're small blocks; so, must make **two** — one using white-on-black and one using black-on-white.

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS BLOCK #1  
Fabric # 1 (White-on-Black Print)  
 Two 1-1/2 x 4-1/2 rectangles (A)  
 Two 1 x 4-1/2 rectangles (B)  
 Two 1-1/2 x 6-1/2 rectangles (C)  
Fabric #3 (Red)  
 Three rectangles 1-1/2 x 4-1/2 (D)

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS BLOCK #2  
Fabric #1 (Black-on-White Print)  
 Two 1-1/2 x 4-1/2 rectangles (A)  
 Two 1 x 4-1/2 rectangles (B)  
 Two 1-1/2 x 6-1/2 rectangles (C)  
Fabric #3 (Red)  
 Three rectangles 1-1/2 x 4-1/2 (D)

**Sewing Instructions:**

Following diagram of block placement, join the 7 rectangles making up the center section.  
 Sew C to sides of block.
